



## Arizona Joint Arts Conference Monday, October 24, 2016

OMA staff is responding to an invitation from Arizona Department of Education Arts Education Specialist Robert Waller to present at this year's Joint Arts Education Conference scheduled for Monday, October 24 at the Herberger Theatre Center in Phoenix, Arizona.

The new *Arizona Academic Standards in the Arts* emphasize artistic literacy and are designed around four core artistic processes:

- Creating
- Performing/Presenting/Producing
- Connecting
- Responding

The interactive session will address Connect and Respond standards sharing best practices for designing artistic literacy and key strategies for richly embedding arts instruction across all academic disciplines. In collaboration with Robert Waller and Joan Ashcraft, Trista Tamura and Jacob Landi will present lessons that can be utilized by arts educators, classroom teachers, and community arts partners.

Ms. Tamura will present a visual arts integration lesson based on the artwork of Alexander Calder utilizing primary colors and torn paper collage to demonstrate an understanding of multiplication for 3<sup>rd</sup> graders.

- **Mathematics Standard:** 3.OA.A.3 Interpret products of whole numbers, e.g., interpret  $5 \times 7$  as the total number of objects in 5 groups of 7 objects each.
- **Standard for Fine Arts – Torn Paper Collage:** PO001. Identify and experiment with materials, tools, and techniques in his or her own artwork

Mr. Landi's lesson will utilize Gustav Holst's *The Planets* to demonstrate music integration with an ELA standard based on compare and contrast for writing experiences.

- **Standard for English Language Arts:** 5.RL.9 – Compare and contrast stories in the same genre on their approaches in the point of view they represent.
- **Standard for Fine Arts – Music:** MU.RE.8.5 – Demonstrate and describe expressive attributes and how they support creators'/ performers' expressive intent.
